MINUTES OF AD HOC ANESTHESIA COMMITTEE

April 21, 2016

The Ad Hoc Anesthesia Committee convened at 6:30 p.m. on April 21, 2016, at the Hampton Inn and Suites, Boise, Idaho. Committee members in attendance were: Dr. Lynn Blaisdell; Dr. Jeffrey Bryson; Dr. Val Garn; Dr. Chuck Hunter; Dr. Ryan Judd; Dr. Kevin Kempers; Dr. Jack Lincks; Dr. Eric Nelson; Dr. Spencer Wirig; Dr. Dan Davidson, Board Member, and Susan Miller, Executive Director, were present. Stephanie Lotridge, Administrative Assistant, was present and recorded the minutes. Dr. Spencer Lloyd, Board Member attended the meeting as a guest.

Dr. Davidson called the meeting to order and the committee reviewed the meeting agenda.

Fred Collings, Chief Investigator for the Idaho Board of Pharmacy, reviewed the current statutes regarding controlled substance registration requirements including the requirement for separate registrations for separate locations. Mr. Collings also reviewed the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP), and drug inventory requirements. The committee suggested adding an additional field to the site evaluation forms asking whether or not the permit holder being evaluated has registered their satellite office with the DEA. Based on the discussion regarding the PMP the committee will recommend the Board add a requirement for continuing education hours related to prescribing practices.

The committee reviewed the Board's draft rule revisions and had no further revisions.

The committee discussed the ADA's proposed revisions to the guidelines for teaching pain control and the guidelines for the use of sedation. Dr. Lloyd stated he attended the testimony hearing via telephone earlier in the week. The committee recommended waiting for the ADA House of Delegates to make a decision on these documents before considering adoption.

The committee discussed the current evaluation forms and a need for regional evaluator training. The committee agreed regional evaluator training is crucial for standardization. Dr. Timothy Hansen was not able to attend the committee meeting but asked the committee via email to consider adding an algorithm regarding the use of Flumazenil for respiratory depression in moderate enteral sedation. The committee will add this algorithm to the "Simulated Emergencies Guide and Algorithm" form for moderate enteral sedation permits.

Ms. Miller asked the committee to consider whether a minimum number of sedation cases should be required annually in order to renew a sedation permit. The committee agreed there should be a requirement and will recommend this to the Board for consideration.

The committee adjourned the meeting at 8:54 p.m.
